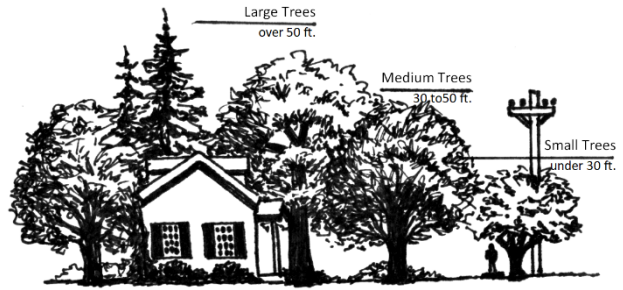

## Tree Planting Request Form

Village residents may request a street tree to be planted on the right-of-way<sup>1</sup> adjacent to your property at the expense of the village subject to the planting schedule and budget of the village. These may not be removed without village permission. Alternatively, property owners may request to plant a tree on the right of way yourself at your own expense. The variety and location must be approved by the Tree Board and planted at least 2 feet from underground utilities (call 811 for marking 1-2 weeks before).
